1. KNOW WHAT

TO THROW GARBAGE.

FOOD SCRAPS & YARD

TRIMMINGS DO NOT belong in

2. MAINTAIN A CLEAN STREAM!

Empty and/or wipe recyclable plastic, metal, and glass food containers. Make sure recyclable paper is clean and dry before placing in the proper **RECYCLABLES** containers.

3. KEEP IT LOOSE! Keep recyclables loose inside your collection container. Recyclables in bags (especially opaque/black ones) are sorted out as garbage and end up in the landfill.

Sorting Tip! Keep an Eye on Size!

Corrugated cardboard and paper boxes should be flattened and large pieces cut to 3' x 3' or smaller. Why?

- · Allows for more room in your cart or bin.
- Prevents litter and container overflow issues.
- Assures the pieces will fit in the hoppers of our trucks for safe and efficient collection of recyclables.

Using the Blue **RECYCLABLES** Split Carts or Dedicated Carts and/or Bins properly means:

- Compliance with the City of Milpitas collection program and State Regulations AB341, AB1826, and SB1383.
- Higher quality product to help meet export requirements.

DID YOU KNOW?

The Truth About Cardboard

- Recycling 1 ton of cardboard saves 46 gallons of oil AND 9 cubic yards of landfill space.
- Recycling cardboard takes only 75% of the energy needed to make new cardboard.

Recycling cardboard makes a big difference and it's easy, just flatten your boxes and cut down any large pieces before placing them inside your recycling container.

California Regulations **Require Recycling** and Composting.

California Senate Bill 1383 requires all Multi-Family Residences, regardless of complex size, to sort RECYCLABLES & ORGANIC material (including food scraps and food-soiled paper) out of the garbage. Visit: www.calrecycle.ca.gov/organics/slcp for more info.

Service Guides, Move in/out Flyers, and Posters: Keep your tenants informed on how to properly sort and prevent waste.

Special Recycling Tote Bags: Make it easy for residents to transport recyclables to the blue recyclables collection container(s) at your complex. Milpitas Sanitation provides one bag per unit at no charge.

Kitchen Food Scraps Pails:* Used to store food scraps until emptied as needed into the food scraps collection containers.





As of January 2022, multi-family complexes are required to offer food scrap recycling services for residents.
