## Spring Cleaning?

### Take Advantage of our On Call Clean-up/Bulky Item Plus+ Program

Milpitas Sanitation provides single-family customers up to four (4) free on call clean-ups/bulky item plus+ pickups per year. Call Milpitas Sanitation at 408-988-4500 when you're ready to schedule one of the following options:



#### Option 1 – Two 1.5 Cubic Yard Bags

MSI will provide two (2) 1.5 cubic yard bags. Load bags in the street curbside and we will pick them up.



#### Option 2 – Fourteen 32-Gallon Garbage Bags

Fill up to fourteen (14) 32-gallon garbage bags and place them in the street curbside for pickup.



#### Option 3 – Bulky Item Plus+ Pickups

Set up to three (3) large, bulky items in the street curbside for collection. Acceptable items include: mattresses, furniture, appliances, exercise equipment, single tires and more. One electronic item, such as a computer or TV, can be included as one of your three items.

Clean-ups/bulky item plus+ pickups must be scheduled at least eight (8) weeks apart and **appointments must be made before items can be placed out at the curb.**

**Have Extra?** Extra on call clean-ups/bulky item plus+ pickups can be arranged for a fee. A special type of collection bin is required for construction and demolition materials such as dirt, sod, cement, rock & brick. **Neighborhood Clean-Up Events are Coming!** The City of Milpitas, together with Milpitas Sanitation, will be holding Neighborhood Clean-Up Events (aka Dumpster Days) to provide debris bins for residents to dispose of one (1) vehicle load of large/bulky items. ## Be a Super Sorter

You can make a difference, proper sorting keeps materials out of the landfill. Placing items in the wrong container is considered contamination and could result in damage to your compostables and recyclables, or even to entire truckloads of collected material. Contaminated materials are disposed of in the landfill. Avoiding contamination is easy with diligence and a bit of practice:

### Tips for sorting your materials:

- MSI uses split-body carts, make sure you are using the correct side for disposal
- Keep liquids out of your carts. Liquids can damage the materials in your carts, making them un-recyclable or un-compostable. Too much liquid could even damage other materials in the collection truck.
- Sort your organic waste carefully. Your green cart is for yard trimmings only. Use the brown section of your non-recycling split cart to dispose of food waste and food soiled paper.

## RESIDENTIAL CURBSIDE COLLECTION PROGRAM Used Motor Oil, Cooking Oil, and Filters

- Contain used oil in sealed 1-gallon, screw-top containers and filters in a sealed zipper-lock style bag. **Please do not mix motor oil and cooking oil.**



- Place containers/bags on the curb (not in the gutter) next to (not inside) your Blue **Recyclables** Split Cart for collection.

- No other automotive liquids accepted (only used motor oil).
- 2 gallons/1 bag collection limit per resident per week.
- Containers/bags are available at fire stations and provided by Milpitas Sanitation. Contact us and we will deliver the containers/bag on your collection day.

## SERVICE REMINDER CARDBOARD COLLECTION TIPS:



- Flatten cardboard and make sure pieces fit in your recycling cart with the lid closed.
- Cut large pieces to 3 feet by 3 feet or less. Doing so allows the pieces to fit in the hoppers of our split collection vehicles. **SEE IT IN ACTION!** Visit our website: [www.MilpitasSanitation.com](http://www.MilpitasSanitation.com) or scan the QR code for a collection video.



- *Have a bit of extra?* Cut pieces to the 3 feet by 3 feet size (they still need to fit in the truck hopper!) and stack next to your blue split recyclables cart for collection.
- *Have A LOT of extra?* Schedule a Bulky Item/On-Call Clean up. (see first page).
