

Sorting Makes a Difference!



We thank you for your efforts!

Milpitas businesses are doing a great job of keeping most recyclable items out of the landfill through proper sorting. Some fine tuning will take recycling to the next level. Recent contamination monitoring in Milpitas showed that these items are frequently placed in the wrong containers:



Cardboard

- 1. Cardboard A lot of cardboard gets wrongly thrown away in the garbage. To recycle *clean* cardboard, place it in the blue recyclables container. If you have a container with a yellow lid,
- Recyclable

Containers

(Empty, Clean, and Dry)

- place the cardboard there.
- 2. Recyclable Containers -Items in this category include glass bottles and jars, metal cans and scrap pieces, aluminum foil, and hard plastic bottles, jars, tubs and trays. These items are often wrongly thrown away in the garbage. Place recyclable containers in the blue recyclables container.

A WORD ABOUT **CARDBOARD**



Please remember to flatten cardboard and paper boxes and cut pieces down to 3' x 3' or smaller if they don't fit in the container.

This helps:

- Maximize space in the recyclables container
- Prevent blockage inside the container
- Keep drivers safe and the collection program efficient

MAINTAIN A **CLEAN STREAM**

Empty and scrape recyclable plastic, metal and glass containers before placing them in the blue recyclables container. Items that are dirty or still have food inside may contaminate clean items, causing the whole load of recyclables to wind up in the landfill.



Remember food-soiled paper and food-soiled cardboard belong in the brown food scraps container.

Have You Received a Senate Bill 1383 Notice? We Can Help!

SB1383 is a state regulation requiring commercial businesses to sort recyclables, food scraps, and yard trimmings out of the garbage. To comply with state regulation, start these services today! Non-Compliance May Lead to Fines and Penalties.

Milpitas Sanitation representatives are available to:

- Assist you with starting, or improving, your recycling, food scraps, and yard trimmings services
- Visit your business to conduct waste assessments
- Make service suggestions
- Provide posters, service guides, desk side recycling boxes, and slim jims
- Help train employees and tenants





Regulations to Remember

AB 827 - Businesses with on-site dining must provide recycling & food scraps collection containers inside for customers. Containers must be easily accessible and clearly marked.



AB 1276 - Businesses selling food and drinks cannot provide single-use foodware accessories or condiments to a customer unless requested. Single-use foodware accessories include:

- Utensils/Chopsticks
- Condiment cups and packets
- Straws/Stirrers
